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SYNOPSIS

ACT I

On Christmas Eve, 1989, in Manhattan's East Village, two roommates—Mark Cohen, a filmmaker, and Roger Davis, a rock musician-struggle to stay warm and produce their art without a penny to their names. Mark, being recently dumped by his outrageous performance artist ex-girlfriend, Maureen Johnson, has a new drive to document "real life" with his friends and experiences in New York City as it faces the HIV/AIDs epidemic. Benny Coffin III, Mark and Roger's former roommate, turned landlord, calls the two starving artists about breaking an earlier agreement and demands that they pay rent, or else (RENT). As they struggle to figure out how to turn their building's power back on, their friend Tom Collins- a gay anarchist professor of computer-age philosophy at NYU- makes a new, special friend, Angel Dumott Schunard, a cross-dressing street drummer who finds Collins wounded in an alley and tends to him, as they both bond over having a similar diagnosis (You Okay Honey). Roger reminisces over his past relationship as he feels left alone to fend his new diagnosis by himself (One Song Glory). He's then unexpectedly visited by their neighbor, Mimi Marquez, who is an exotic dancer and junkie, asking for a helping hand (Will You Light My Candle). Mark comes home, and Benny arrives, speaking of Maureen's upcoming protest against his plans to evict the homeless from a lot where he is hoping to build a cyber arts studio. Benny offers that, if they convince Maureen to cancel the protest, then Mark and Roger can officially remain rent-free tenants (You'll See). Mark goes to help Maureen with the sound equipment for the protest, unexpectedly meeting Joanne Jefferson, Maureen's new girlfriend who's a lawyer. Initially hesitant with each other, the two eventually bond over their shared distrust of Maureen's "gaslighting" and promiscuous behavior (Tango Maureen). Mark continues to document "real life" by joining Collins and Angel to film their HIV support group meeting, which Roger reflects on while thinking about his fear of dying without a purpose (*Life Support*). Roger takes his chance and apologizes to Mimi, inviting her to come to Maureen's eccentric performance protest and the dinner party his friends are having afterwards. Maureen begins her avant-garde, new age performance based on "Hey Diddle Diddle" until the protest turns into a post-show party at the Life Café (Over the Moon). Benny arrives, criticizing the protest and the group's bohemian lifestyle. In response, Mark and his group defiantly rise up to celebrate their way of living (La Vie Bohème).

ACT II

The cast lines up to sing a vulnerable, yet empowering tune, affirming that one should measure life "in love" prefacing the second act (Seasons of Love). On New Year's Eve, the group of friends gather to break back into Mark and Roger's apartment (Happy New Year). Benny arrives, saying he wants to call a truce and revealing that Mimi—who used to be his girlfriend—convinced him to change his mind. Mimi denies rekindling her relationship with Benny, but Roger is upset, and although they apologize to each other, Mimi goes to her drug dealer to cope with her frustrations by using again (Happy New Year B). When preparing for another upcoming protest, Maureen criticizes Joanne's controlling behavior, and Joanne criticizes Maureen's promiscuous mannerisms, resulting in a dramatic break up (Take Me or Leave Me). Come spring time, Roger and Mimi's relationship is strained by her escalating heroin use and Roger's lasting jealousy and suspicion of Benny. Each alone, Roger and Mimi sing of love and loneliness, as they watch Collins nurse Angel, whose health is drastically declining due to AIDS (Without You). By the end of summer, Mark continues to receive calls offering him a corporate job, questioning his devotion to his life's work. Angel falls deeper into illness and has a fever dream representing all the couples' sex lives where the climax results in the two former couples breaking up, and Angel's sudden death (Contact). At Angel's funeral, the friends briefly reunite to share their memories (I'll Cover You Reprise). The funeral sparks arguments amongst the friend group and they realize that their close-knit friendships will be disintegrating due to Angel's death, Roger moving, and relationships ending. Mark tries to convince Roger to stay in New York, but Roger is unable to handle Mimi's declining health. Collins, unable to pay for Angel's funeral, is comforted by Benny and rekindles their old friendship. In the winter, Mark and Roger simultaneously reach an artistic epiphany, as Roger finds his song in Mimi and Mark finds his film in Angel's memory. Roger decides to return to New York in time for Christmas, while Mark devotes his efforts to working on his own film (What You Own). On Christmas Eve, 1990, one year since the beginning of their story, Mark prepares to screen his now-completed film to his friends. Roger has written his song, but no one can find Mimi for him to play it to. Maureen and Joanne hastily enter carrying Mimi, who has been homeless, sick, and is close to death. As she begins to fade, she tells Roger that she loves him, as he plays her the song he wrote for her to reveal the depth of his feelings (Finale A/Your Eyes). Mimi appears to die, but abruptly awakens after seeing a vision of Angel surrounded by a white light, telling her to return to Earth and stay with Roger. The remaining friends gather in a final moment of shared happiness with the time they have left with each other, because there is "no day but today" (Finale B).

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Over thirty years ago, Jonathan Larson's *Rent* had its first staged reading at the New York Theatre Workshop. Larson had huge aspirations for his musical based on Puccini's *La Bohème*. Broadway, at the time, was running enormous spectacles such as *Phantom of the Opera, Cats,* and *Les Miserables* or the intellectual explorations of the human condition in Sondheim's *Into the Woods,* and *Sunday in the Park With George*. Larson wanted to create something for the average person—"to bring musical theatre to the MTV generation." In doing so, he revolutionized and forever changed musical theatre and had profound impact on a generation of theatre goers and geeks. It has become a cultural touchstone.

Rent, like all great theatre, reflects its time. The country was still in the throes of the AIDS epidemic, New York City was being transformed by gentrification and commercialization. Once seedy yet creative and bohemian enclaves were being sanitized by developers looking to make a profit. Rudy Giuliani was running for Mayor with a "tough on crime" platform and promised "civic clean-up" in New York City. But while *Rent* reflects these larger economic and social changes in the context of its day, it also brings to life the personal struggle of being able to pay the "rent". Rent, also has a double meaning—"to be torn or to separate into parts with force or violence."

The vibrant characters at the center of *Rent*, are torn apart by addiction, disease, homelessness, and the age-old struggle between art and commerce. The struggle for Larson and nearly all artists is sometime between making art and making a living. Mark epitomizes this struggle. Roger, knowing that his life might be cut short, struggles with what, if anything, he will leave behind to signify that he was here.

When I was asked if I was interested in directing this show, I had two main concerns or questions: Could I bring this story to life in a compelling way with the available resources and could we find the artists with the acting and vocal skills who could bring these characters to life? I believed that we could answer yes to the first question. With the talent and hard work of the entire creative team and the production staff, this could be achieved. The answer the second question was one I worried about the most. Could we find the talent locally? I wasn't sure. But to my amazement, those theatre goers and geeks, the "MTV generation" who grew up listening, and watching, and performing *Rent* came out for the auditions.

Rent has inspired a new generation of theatre artists and creators. Its legacy are other rock musicals that include *Spring Awakening, Next to Normal,* and Lin Manuel Miranda's *Hamilton.* Unfortunately, Larson died on the opening day of *Rent's* Broadway debut. He never was witness to his impact on theatre. On the 20th anniversary of *Rent's* move to Broadway, Lin Manuel Miranda wrote on Twitter: "I think about an alternate timeline where Jonathan Larson is 56 years old, with many shows written & more on the way." Larson lived, died, and told his story, and musical theatre would never be the same.






Matthew Mazuroski (Director/Scenic Designer) is thrilled to be working on this production of Rent with such a talented group of actors, designers, and technical crew! Over nearly 40 years, Matthew has worked across the country as an actor, director, fight-choreographer and theatre educator. His professional acting credits include: Nick in *Whose Afraid of Virginia Woolfe* with Phoenix Theatre, Bob Cratchit in *A Christmas Carol* with Actors Theatre of Phoenix, Hysterium in *Forum* with Whitehall Theatre, Malvolio in *Twelfth Night* with The National Players, and the title role in *Hamlet* with the UK/ AZ Festival. He served as the founding artistic and marketing director of The Actors Group, located in Phoenix Arizona, from 1993 until 1997. From 1995-98 Matthew was the lead program coordinator and curriculum developer

for Theatre at The Arizona School of the Arts—a Charter School that served grades 6-9. From 1998 until 2001, he traveled throughout the United States and the United Kingdom as a Trainer with Pryor Resources. From the fall of 2005 thru the spring of 2011, Matthew was the Performing Arts Coordinator and an Adjunct Professor of Theatre at Franklin & Marshall College in Lancaster, PA.

Matthew has directed nearly 75 university or professional productions. He has worked as the fight choreographer for over 60 productions. Some of his award-winning productions as director include *Bent, The Grapes of Wrath, Buried Child, Before it Hits Home, David's Mother, Twilight of the Golds, The Crucible, Buried Child* and *The Laramie Project*. He has collaborated with playwrights on staged readings, workshop readings, and has helped develop scripts from readings through full productions. He also directed the production of *Jackie & Me* for Children's Theatre of Charlotte where it was selected as one of the best productions for the 2014-2015 theater season. He is also a member of Actors Equity and has performed in the tri-state area productions that include: Unseem'd Shakespeare's production of *Out of this Furnace* in Pittsburgh, and *Harry's Friendly Service, American Buffalo,* and *Keely and Du* for the Youngstown Playhouse and most recently as Bert Barricune in the Hopewell Theatre's production of *The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance*.

Matthew is retiring in May as the Associate Professor of Acting/Directing for the University Theatre for Youngstown State University where he taught Acting, Directing, Improvisation, Theatre for Young Audiences, Stage Combat, Advanced Acting, Acting for Film, Neutral and Character Mask, and Devised Theatre. For YSU he has directed 21 productions including: *A Streetcar Named Desire*, *Early One Evening at the Rainbow Bar & Grille, Broke-ology, The Cherry Orchard, Tartuffe, The Spitfire Grille, Mr. Wheeler's, Twelfth Night, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, The Addams Family, Into the Woods, Cabaret,* and *Romeo & Juliet* to name a few. He also directed YSU's production of *Dead Man's Cell Phone* which was selected by the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival to perform at the Region 2 Festival and received National KCACTF Certificates of Merit. This is the first time YSU was selected and so recognized. In 2014 he directed a production of *Broke-ology.* This was the first-time in the history of the theatre program at YSU that a play, written by an African-American playwright, and featuring an all African-American cast was produced at Youngstown State University.

He served as the Chairperson for the Department of Theatre & Dance from 2016-2019. While Chair, he initiated the Department's Festival of New Works that celebrates student generated original work in playwrighting, film-making, choreography, and devised theatre.

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
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
