



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"It is a chronicle of love and no love, of interiors and exteriors, of weather, change, entry-level psychology, and time; but, oh, lo --- what chronicle isn't." Opening Prologue of *The Flu Season*.

One of my favorite spaces to work as a director is The Moyer Room at The Youngstown Playhouse. Small and intimate, it allows a director to work with new and inventive scripts, scripts that are not just popular entertainment, but also exercise for the mind. Plays that challenge not only a director, but are a workout for the actors and the audience alike. *The Flu Season* is the perfect example of such a script. Chicago Theatre critic Tom Williams says "*The Flu Season* is one of those plays that should be seen by serious theatre goers because of its inventiveness. The work creeps up on you and leaves you thinking about it long after you leave the theatre."

I have long been a fan of Will Eno. I think he is one of the funniest playwrights working today. He plays with language as well as anyone. *The Flu Season* was the winner of the 2004 Oppenheimer Award for the best New York debut by an American playwright. His play, *Thom Pain (based on nothing)* was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in Drama in 2005. His play *The Realistic Joneses* appeared on Broadway in 2014, where it received a Drama Desk Special Award and was named Best Play on Broadway by USA Today, and best American play of 2014 by The Guardian. His play *The Open House* was presented Off-Broadway at the Signature Theatre in 2014 and won the Obie Award for Playwriting as well as other awards, and was on both TIME Magazine and Time Out New York 's Top Ten Plays of 2014.

The Flu Season proceeds on two different levels. The play opens as we meet two characters called The Prologue and Epilogue. These two characters, it turns out, might be different aspects of the same person and that person might be a playwright writing a play as we the audience are allowed to watch. We meet the characters being created; a Man, a Woman, a Nurse and a Doctor. We find ourselves at The Crossroads Psychiatric Retreat Center just before winter.

Eno never allows the audience to simply sink into a story about a relationship between a man and a woman. The Prologue and Epilogue step in often to remind us in very Brechtian terms that this is theatre, that we are being manipulated. Sometimes The Prologue falls victim to the characters and the play takes on unexpected turns.

As an audience member, it's best to let yourself sink into the conceit of the play, laugh hilariously and feel all the feels. Go ahead and jump on the merrygo-round and enjoy the wacky ride. We've had a wonderful time dipping our minds into another dimension with Will Eno. We hope you do also.

WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

MATTHEW MAZUROSKI (Prologue). Matthew has worked across the country as an actor, director, fight choreographer, and theatre educator. He has directed nearly 90 university or professional productions. Matthew is thrilled to be working with The Youngstown Playhouse once again. His past Playhouse productions include directing August, Osage County, The Elephant Man, Noises Off, Good People, and Our Lady of 121st Street; acting in Harry's Friendly Service, American Buffalo, and Keely & Du as well as set and sound designing for a number of notable productions. Most recently, he directed and set designed the local production of Rent mounted at DeYor Performing Arts Center in March of 2023.

Matthew has taught all levels of University acting, directing, stage combat, improvisation, film acting, and playwriting. He has worked as the fight choreographer for over 100 productions. Some of his award-winning productions as director include Bent, The Grapes of Wrath, and Buried Child. He has collaborated with playwrights on play development. Matthew also directed the production of Jackie & Me for Children's Theatre of Charlotte where it was selected as one of the best productions for the 2014-2015 theater season. He recently retired as a Professor of theatre at Youngstown State University. Matthew would like to thank his wonderful partner in life, Pat Foltz, for her love, intellect, talent, and support over the past 35 years!

ERIC KIBLER (Epilogue). Eric has appeared in or directed over 150 productions on area stages. Some favorite recent roles are Silvio (a Vietnam vet down on his luck) in *The Day They Shot* John Lennon here in the Moyer Room, Selsdon (the hard-drinking veteran actor) in *Noises Off* on the Playhouse mainstage, and noted lawyer Clarence Darrow in the one-man show at Selah Theatre. For Mahoning Valley Players, Eric has recently directed *Complete Works of William Shakespeare*, *Abridged*, and *The Tempest*. Eric is a lawyer, and his family members (wife Amy-Anne and offspring Maja and Elsie) are also active in community theatre.

JAMES HAIN (Doctor). James has appeared in nearly 100 shows. Some of his favorite roles include Dogberry in Much Ado About Nothing, Yvan in Art, and Titus in Titus Andronicus. He was last seen at the Playhouse as Tim in Noises Off.

ADAM DOMINICK (Man). Adam is thrilled to be making his Youngstown Playhouse acting debut in *The Flu Season*! This will be the first straight play he has performed in seven years. Recently, Adam directed his original full-length musical *The Other Side* which premiered at Hopewell Theatre. You may have seen him on the stage in The Valley, as Michael in *Tony n Tina's Wedding* (MTC), Marcellus in *The Music Man: In Concert* (YSU), Seymour in *Little Shop of Horrors* (YSU), and many other YSU mainstage productions. Offstage, Adam can be found at Students Motivated by the Arts (SMARTS) downtown as the Staff Assistant. He'd like to thank his partner, Sydney, for being a constant source of encouragement and love.

JEANINE REES (Nurse). Jeanine has been involved with theatre, both on stage and behind the scenes, since 1989. 


